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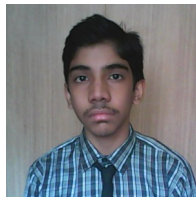

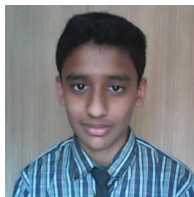

International Yoga Day Celebration

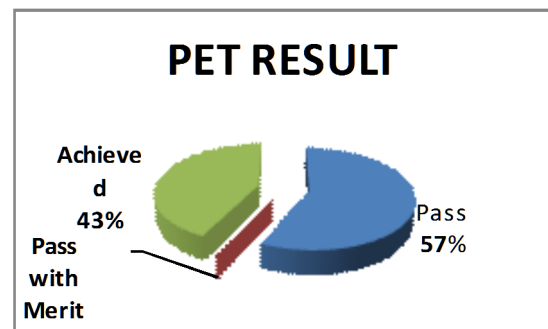
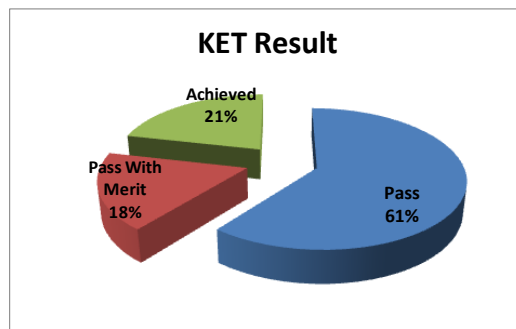

So I conclude by saying that, "Monitors enjoy their work, but suffer for you, So try to help them in the struggle for you"

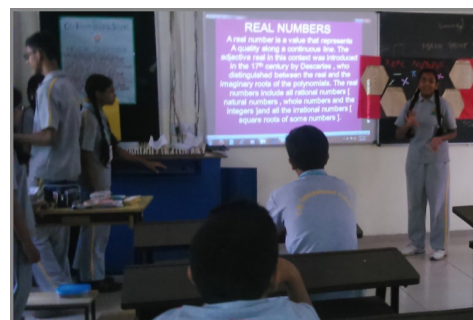

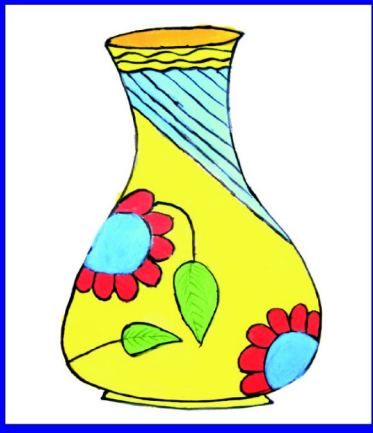

Reading does make you knowledgeable. The more you read, the diverse books you read, each time you are adding valuable pieces of knowledge to your brain.

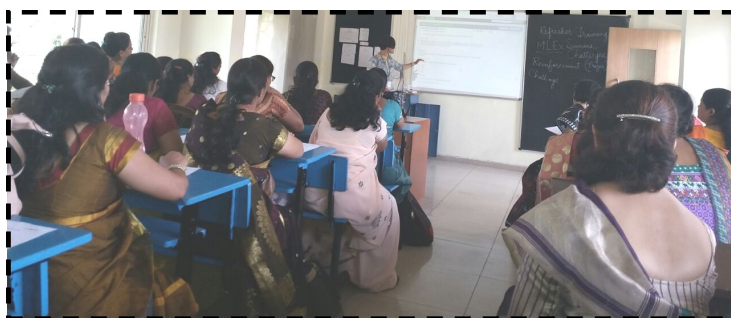
Reading boosts Creativity. Creative people are very good readers and because of that they are knowledgeable. Keep reading and you will definitely be more creative in whatever area you choose.
